Curriculum News

Post OFSTED it has been suggested by a couple of parents that it would be a good idea to update parents and carers on our progress. I want to reassure you that our School Improvement Plan already echoed the inspectors findings with regard to curriculum. We had planned our curriculum over a four year cycle in 2019 and because of lockdown only had two terms to embed. Our school is still on the same journey.

We had been advised pre-lockdown that our school should have curriculum co-ordinators, despite my concerns. Three years on and we know it can not work in a small school. I am in the West Lancashire Small Schools Heads cluster and we discuss best practice regularly. It is this element that we are planning to change. We work as a senior leadership team, sharing our expertise and up-skilling in different curriculum subjects on a regular cyclical schedule. Anyone wishing to see this rigorous schedule is welcome to. Our curriculum intent is very clear for each subject on our website. I monitor progress, the governors come in and report back to the committee and we have school and monitoring and intervention advisors who also help. We engage in moderation across schools in the county. For example Miss Whiteside and myself, recently worked with the English coordinator from Town Green Primary School to compare work in children's books and ensure our expectations are the same. Mrs. Zaim took us successfully through Lancashire Writing Moderation with LCC Advisor, Richard Kershaw.

This term we have purchased a new scheme to teach phonics. The government have changed criteria and decreed the old scheme that many schools use, as no longer fit for purpose. Lancashire have created a new Red Rose Letters and Sounds scheme. We have invested in this scheme as it matches our wonderful phonically decodable guided reading books, that your children use. We will be trained in the delivery this term. We are excited to learn all about it. Miss Whiteside will arrange a session where parents can come in and acquaint themselves with any changes and ideas for what best to do at home to help your children.
